K-Kids Clean-up Titusville Beach

K-Kids of Apollo and Imperial Estates Elementary Schools in Titusville collected 25 bags of trash from Playa Linda Beach on the last Saturday in May. The kids teamed up with employees from Sea World and Keep Brevard Beautiful.

"The kids had a list of projects that they voted on. They wanted to do something to help save the sea turtles and to do some sort of park or environmental clean-up" said Kiwanis advisor, Rebecca Burnett. One of the kids commented that this was a two for one project, she said.

Among the trash items collected by the kids, their parents and supporting Kiwanians were a barbecue grill, a propane tank and glass tubing from fluorescent lights. All of the items were sorted and recycled.

"I wanted to do this so that people can enjoy the beach more without all the garbage." Said 10 year old Stephanie Witt. "People who litter just don't think about what they're doing and how they're endangering the area for animals and other people," she said.

Kelly Rogers, supervisor of education and conservation at Sea World, said that she and her team were more than happy to be part of the K-Kids project. She hopes the partnership will continue in the future.
